# What is Hepatitis?

Hepatitis is an infection that causes inflammation of the liver. This inflammation can cause damage and disrupt the liver's ability to function properly. Some types of hepatitis can cause chronic or long-term damage to the liver. This is why it is important to determine the cause of the inflammation and treat it correctly. There are five main hepatitis viruses, see a summary of each type below.

#### **Hepatitis A**

 Vaccine: YES • Treatment: YES

• Cure: Most people make a full

The virus is primarily spread when an uninfected (and unvaccinated) person ingests food or water that is contaminated with the feces of an infected person. The disease is closely associated with unsafe water or food, inadequate sanitation, poor personal hygiene, and oral-anal sex.

#### **Hepatitis B**

Vaccine: YES

• Treatment: YES

• Cure: In development Hepatitis B is potentially lifethreatening and is a major global health problem. It can cause chronic infection and puts people at high risk of death from cirrhosis and liver cancer. A safe and effective vaccine that offers 98% to 100% protection against hepatitis B is available. Preventing hepatitis B infection averts the development of complications including chronic disease and liver cancer.

#### **Hepatitis C**

 Vaccine: NO • Treatment: YES

· Cure: YES

The hepatitis C virus is a bloodborne virus, which causes both acute and chronic infection. It is most commonly transmitted through:

- the reuse or inadequate sterilization of medical equipment, especially syringes and needles in healthcare
- · the transfusion of unscreened

blood and blood products; and

• injecting drug use through the sharing of injection equipment.

#### **Hepatitis D**

- Vaccine: NO (although hepatitis D only affects people living with hepatitis B for which there is a vaccine)
- Treatment: YES
- Cure: NO

This infection is unique because to be infected with hepatitis D the person also has to be infected with hepatitis B.

#### Hepatitis E

Vaccine: NO

• Treatment: YES

• Cure: Most people make a full recovery

The virus is shed in the stools of infected persons and enters the human body through the intestine. It is transmitted mainly through contaminated drinking water.
